IMPORTANT UPDATES IN 2024



PAY STRUCTURE

This year our team is evaluating our pay rates across projects! Because of this, **you may see changes in how pay rates for each project are structured and communicated.** We value your experience and expertise and want to ensure compensation accurately reflects your efforts.

BONUS CHANGE



Historically, we often default to "big" bonuses at the end of projects. In 2024, after completing WAIS 5 and WMS 5, **we will change how we utilize bonuses throughout a project.** As noted above, we are looking at our overall pay structure. We are also looking at new, creative incentives we can employ throughout a project. We want to use bonuses more strategically to reward those examiners who are consistently helping us find the candidates we need. We aren't sure exactly what this will look like yet, but are excited to try some new things in 2024! One idea is to offer unique incentive options early in the project - this allows us to have some fun while also meeting our budgets and schedules.



REFERRALS

We are also reviewing our current referral process and have decided that after completing WMS 5, our current referral bonus will no longer be available. However, we have exciting changes coming! As mentioned earlier, we will be restructuring pay rates and incorporating incentives in 2024 designed to reflect how crucial your work with us is. As we reevaluate our referral process, we encourage you to continue using your current candidate pool for recruitment. Your candidate recruitment efforts ensure that the data collected reflects the diverse populations you serve.

TRACKING NUMBERS



As you know, each assignment has a due date. It is imperative tests arrive at Pearson by that due date. Please keep in contact with our team if a due date needs to be extended. Overdue assignments will be canceled. We also need you to keep track of all tracking numbers as tests are mailed to Pearson. Beginning in 2024, in the unfortunate instance a test is lost in the mail - *we will only be able to pay you if you provide a tracking number.* The Candidate will always be paid.

PILOT STUDIES

We are wrapping up the WMS 5 Standardization, but currently, *most of our remaining projects planned for 2024 will be pilots.* Pilots are one of our earliest research phases on a project. Therefore, they usually have smaller sample sizes. Given the smaller size, only a select number of examiners can participate per project. Aside from the size, you may also notice that materials reflect the early stages of development and may not have all of our typical design elements found in the final product. Because we are in the early stages of development, it's an excellent opportunity to give feedback and get a "sneak peek" at what is new!

UPCOMING PROJECTS

We have a great year ahead! Upcoming projects in 2024 are: BASC 4 pilot: Spring 2024 CELF 6 pilot: Summer 2024 BASC 4 Standardization is coming end of 2024!

Please begin recruiting candidates aged 2 - 21 now! Pilot projects will have smaller sample sizes, so examiners with access to younger candidates will be more likely to be selected for participation.
